Balancing College Choices & Factoring Selectivity

It is recommended students apply to 3-5 colleges

LIKELY: A school that typically accepts students with similar credentials.




<u>REACH</u>: A school where chances of being rejected are higher than being accepted, but some students with similar credentials have been admitted.

Students are encouraged to apply to at 1 reach school.



College Applications

- Go to the college website
- It is the student's responsibility to know their deadlines and what is needed for their application
 - ❖ i.e. Letters of Recommendation, Essay, transcript vs. SSAR
- Most applications are completed online either
 - ❖ Through the college's website
 - Common Application
- * Fee waivers available if qualify for free/reduced lunch

College Entrance Exams ACT/SAT Information

Should take in March/April and May/June- and at least once in their senior year if not satisfied with the scores

ACT

- Registration: <u>www.actstudent.org</u>
- It is recommended students take ACT plus Writing

SAT

- Registration: www.collegeboard.org
- It is recommended students take SAT plus Writing
- Watch registration deadlines!
- Four free score reports if indicate colleges before testing, cost if order after test
- Takes 4-6 weeks for a college to receive scores
- Fee waivers available if student qualifies for free and reduced lunch

Test Preparation



- Khan Academy- Free preparation through College Board.
 Linking PSAT scores gives individualized program.

ACT

- ACT Academy- a free online learning tool and test practice program. Must enter scores to get individualized program.

Campus Visits

- Varies by families/student
 - Option to wait until acceptance senior year

 Talk to specific schools and ask if they offer prospective student nights or open houses

- Visit local schools
 - Experience difference between sizes or public vs.
 private
 - Register on their admissions office



Financial Aid

- FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)
 - o Opens Oct. 1st of Senior Year
 - Will provide financial aid based on need
 - FAFSA4caster gives you a free early estimate of your eligibility for federal student aid: fafsa.ed.gov
- Scholarships
 - Majority will come from college directly
 - Check local organizations, places of work, updated on Naviance and Schoology
 - Usually based on Merit (Grades, Scores)
- Sticker price Vs. Actual Price
 - Will not know the actual price until accepted and receive financial aid award letter (Spring Senior Year)

Junior Year

- Register for the SAT/ACT
 - Plan time to study/review for the exam
- Begin developing college list
- Summer Programs



Senior Year

- □ September/October
 - Senior Parent Night & FAFSA Info Night
 - College Fair
 - October 1st -FAFSA Opens (fafsa.ed.gov)
 - □ October 15th- Earliest Deadline
- November 1st
 - Early Action/Early Decision Deadlines.
 Can mean early acceptance notification and/or priority for scholarships
- Rolling and regular admission deadlines throughout the year. All deadlines vary depending on school
