
- ► Things to Consider:

Graduation Requirements

- Diploma Options: 24 Credits—Scholars, Merit, Standard Diploma (or) 18 Credits
- ▶ **Assessments**: Algebra I EOC & 10th Grade FSA ELA
- Academic Credits: 4 English, 4 Math, 3 Science, 3 Social Studies
- Fine Art credit, Personal Fitness half credit, & Physical Education half credit
- Electives—to include Foreign Language for college entrance
- ▶ FLVS--online course
- Community Service Project
- ► GPA: 2.00 Minimum Un-weighted

- ► MDC and FIU only
- ▶ 3.0 unweighted GPA required
- ▶ It is a way to explore an interest or take courses not offered at our school.
- It is not the way to accelerate in math.
- ▶ It is considered equal to an AP course
- Summer Term
 - May and June start dates
 - Registration will occur after spring break.
- Fall Term
 - August start date
 - Registration must be complete prior to June 3


What do Colleges Look For?
